UNWIND IN PATERNOSTER

A trip up the West Coast is a chance to adopt nature's pace and reset your equilibrium. Located in Bekbaai, a quiet cove to the south of Paternoster, Gonana Guest House is situated at the top of the dunes that lead down to the beach and offers uninterrupted views. The quest house is a member of Cape Country Routes and everything about it encourages you to slow down and become aware of the beauty around you. The rooms open onto the indigenous garden and at the front of the house you can sit on your veranda and look out at the sea. Or you can go upstairs and, seated at a long wooden table, you'll enjoy the same sea view. Leather couches and comfy chairs form cosy nooks where you can sit with a book or simply gaze out the window. The aesthetic is very different to the traditional beach look that's associated with the West Coast. As you might expect from a Swedish owner, the guest house's interiors have a Scandinavian feel; blonde wood and neutral colours characterise the airy, light-flooded spaces. And yet, the environment remains wholly African, with woven decorations and handcrafted pots. Owner Jonas Sandström believes in the motto 'think global, buy local' and Gonana's decor is testament to this. The guest house is virtually off the grid, thanks to solar panels, rainwater collection tanks and a greywater recycling system. Gonana's approach to touching the Earth lightly helps you tune in to nature. It's a style that Jonas and his partner, Martin, call 'barefoot luxury'. 05 GOOD THINGS COME IN SMALL PACKAGES

Located along the longest wine route in the world. The Robertson Small Hotel was established in 2011 and is Robertson's only five-star hotel. In the winter of 2016, owner Tim Rands entrusted his daughter, Abigail, with the task of renovating the hotel from top to bottom. Curated by Studio Ashby in London, the redesign saw local designers and collaborators tasked with creating bespoke items to form part of a brand-new look while enhancing this country gem. Renovations to the manor house (built in 1909 and now a national monument), the Stable and Poolside suites, gardens and wellness room, were carried out by a team of local designers and artists, including Alexis Barrel, Michael Chandler, Renée Rossouw, House of Gozdawa, Lisa Firer and René Botes. Elements of the renewed design can be found in every detail of the hotel: artistic textiles, a carefully curated in-room publication called The Small Guide, fine wine, signature perfume for rooms and halls, hand-selected decor and even unique room key chains. Legendary chef Chris Erasmus, of Foliage fame in Franschhoek, is head chef at The Small Restaurant.

QUICK ESCAPE TO KRUGER

Five-star Tintswalo Safari Lodge and CemAir have joined forces to offer fly-in safaris from Cape Town to Hoedspruit with a 45-minute road transfer to the lodge.
